

Known unknowns: things we know we don't know


Unknown unknowns: things we don't know we don't know

Rumsveld-Žižekian epistemology applied to the structure of the psyche

- Known knowns: the conscious register
- 2. Known unknowns: descriptively unconscious (symbolised content)
- Unknown unknowns: dynamically unconscious (unsymbolised)
- 4. Unknown knowns: ideology



German Romanticism

- Circa 1798 to 1837 CE
- (German: Deutsche Romantik)
 was the dominant intellectual
 movement of German-speaking
 countries in the late 18th and
 early 19th centuries, influencing
 philosophy, aesthetics,
 literature, and criticism.





Quaternity of German Idealists

- Immanuel Kant (1724 1804)
- Friedrich Wilhelm Joseph Schelling (1775 1854)
- Arthur Schopenhauer (1788 1860)
- Georg Wilhelm Friedrich Hegel (1770 -1831)

the unconscious 'Unbewusste'

- **Kant**: transcendental idealism. Kant's contribution here is two-fold: noumenal-phenomenal divide, a priori categories of pure reason
- **Schelling**, naturphilosophie, the irrational, nature as source of renewal and inspiration, the unconscious soul of man being an artifact of nature, uncivilised, uncultured and untamed.
- **Schopenhauer**: the idea of will and representation, "You can do as you will, but not will as you will."
- **Hegel: and Hegelian dialectics**, typically referred to as the master-bondsman or master-slave dialectic
